Copiapue is a multicultural residential community with a population of 25,000. It is located on the southwest corner of Suffolk County, approximately 35 miles east of New York City. The school district consists of one high school, one middle school and four elementary schools, with a total enrollment of 4,650 students, of which 355 are members of the graduating class of 2023.

Walter G. O'Connell Copiapue High School is a public high school in Copiapue, New York, that was established in 1967. The population is approximately 1,500 students and the average class size is approximately 25. The student-to-counselor ratio is approximately 215:1. 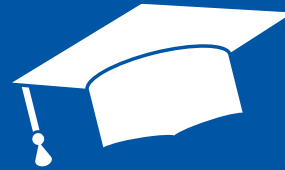
Our Community



The New York State Education Department requires the completion of 22 units of credit and the achievement of grades of 65% or better on the following Regents exams: English Language Arts, Global Studies, U.S. History, Common Core Algebra, and one science exam. Advanced Designation Regents Diplomas require the successful completion of additional exams and coursework. Credit distribution is as follows:

- English (4 credits)
- Science (3 credits, 1 lab science)
- Physical Education (2 credits)
- Social Studies (4 credits)
- Language Other Than English (1 credit)
- Health (.5 credit)
- Math (3 credits)
- Art/Music (1 credit)
- Electives (3.5 credits)

Graduation Requirements



All candidates for graduation are ranked in numerical order of performance. The student with the highest academic achievement is designated as the valedictorian. Rank is determined by the student's performance in all courses, including physical education. Courses are weighted equally with Advanced Placement designations. Honors courses and Advanced Placement courses are weighted 1.15 in the calculation. Courses shown on the transcript do not include the weighting.

High School is a four-year public school. The population of the school is approximately 1,200 students. The average class size is 28 students. The student-to-teacher ratio is 15:1. The school calendar consists of two semesters with two grading periods. All core academic courses are assigned one credit.

Class of 2022 Placement Statistics

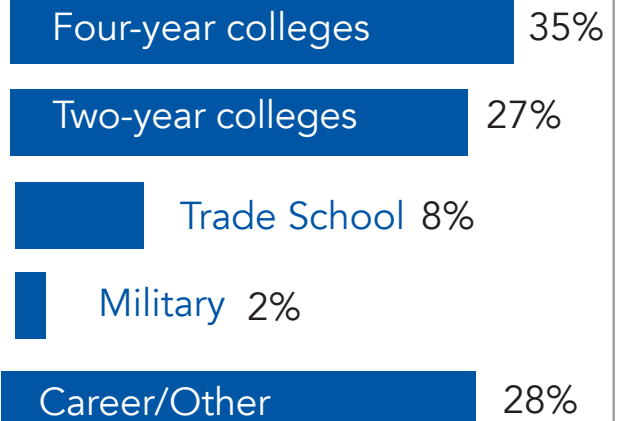


Walter G. O'Connell Copiague High School offers a rigorous, comprehensive curriculum in an environment that encourages students to meet high standards. In addition to Regents-level courses, Honors, Advanced Placement and college-level courses are offered. There are no restrictions on the number of Honors or Advanced Placement courses a student can take; however, enrollment is subject to teacher approval. Our school offers 26 Honors-level courses, 16 Advanced Placement courses and 11 college-level courses.

College-level courses: English, Astronomy, Environmental Science, Robotics, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Spanish IV & V, Italian IV & V.

Advanced Placement Courses: English Literature & Composition, English Language & Composition, Psychology, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, U.S. History, World History, U.S. Government & Politics, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Calculus AB, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Research, Seminar.

Curricular sequence based upon scholastic performance. The school's average is ranked No. 1 and is the highest at the conclusion of the student's sixth year of rank and GPA with the exception of students with the exception of courses with Honors or AP. Honors courses are weighted 1.05 and Advanced Placement courses are weighted 1.25. Final course grades are based on the following scale.
